There are a number of options covering updates from all parts of the District.

School council insurance

The OCDSB provides school council liability insurance. This coverage provides protection for the school council executive members and all volunteers acting on behalf of the school council that may face lawsuits arising out of their activities for the school council. The coverage is for various types of liabilities arising out of injuries to third parties or damage to leased or borrowed premises.

This year's school council insurance coverage has been paid for by the District and will be provided through the Ontario School Boards' Insurance Exchange (OSBIE) and Arthur J. Gallagher Canada Limited Brokers.

Insurance Coverage Highlights:

- Annual policy, effective November 1st of each year;
- \$2 million liability coverage;
- Coverage includes: negligent acts causing bodily injury and property damage, personal injury and advertising liability, tenants legal liability, non-owned automobile liability, errors and omissions, directors and officers wrongful acts.

Non sanctioned events require additional insurance and the OCDSB has purchased this for School Councils for events that are usually held at the school and attended by both parents and students, such as movie nights, book fairs, and bake sales. School council members would need to ensure that District policies and procedures are followed by consulting with the principal and the principal approval of the event.

The school council liability policy provides coverage for the school council executive members and all volunteers acting on behalf of the school council that may face lawsuits arising out of their activities for the school council. The coverage is for various types of liabilities arising out of negligent acts. This is liability insurance, it is not an accident policy.

Movie night would be considered an expected activity done by the School Council.

Funfair - we will need to have a discussion over funfair. The advice I have gotten is we would need additional insurance, along with vendors holding their own liability insurance that covers us.
